

The *Abbot Fletcher Sailing School* is named for the late Abbot Fletcher, a long-time member of OBYC and resident of Orr's Island. Abbot raced and sailed on Merriconeag Sound with his grandfather, Rear Admiral William B. Fletcher, in a 32 ft. gaff-rigged sloop "Juanona" from the 1930s to 1950s. He later owned a 38 ft. sloop "Majek" in which he had a long and distinguished career, winning dozens of races including multiple Monhegan Island and Marion, MA to Bermuda Races. Abbot shared his love of sailing with his family and with all who sailed with him, including the Bowdoin Sailing Team of which he was coach for many years.

### **Where We Are**

OBYC is on the southwest tip of Orr's Island. Take Route 24 South. Turn right on Merritt House Road (last road on the right before the Cribstone Bridge). Turn right on Osbourne ROW. The OBYC sign is dead ahead. Bear left and circle around to find a parking space. Please drive slowly.

### Beginner

The students attending this session will learn the basics of sailing, both in the classroom and on the water. Topics covered will include sailing vocabulary, basic sail trim and points of sail. This session also teaches sailing away from the dock and returning, holding a steady course, the maneuvers of coming about, falling off, heading up and jibing and tying basic knots.

### Intermediate

The Intermediate session picks up where the Beginner session leaves off. Its goal is to help sailing students achieve the level of skill and self-confidence necessary to sail independently. The emphasis is on safety--adapting the skills learned in the beginner class to the higher after-noon winds, and developing sailing judgment with a greater awareness of one's surroundings while on the water.

### Optimist and 420 Racing

The racing teams consist of students who have the desire to compete and learn the technical side of sailing. This is a three week session from 9:30—4:00 p.m. For the Opti program, you must have completed the Beginner course. For the 420 team, you should have some Intermediate experience. We are part of the Maine Interclub Racing Circuit and the Northeast Sailing Association. Each of these associations has races consisting of one or two days. None require an overnight. We also participate in local regattas that are usually two-day events
